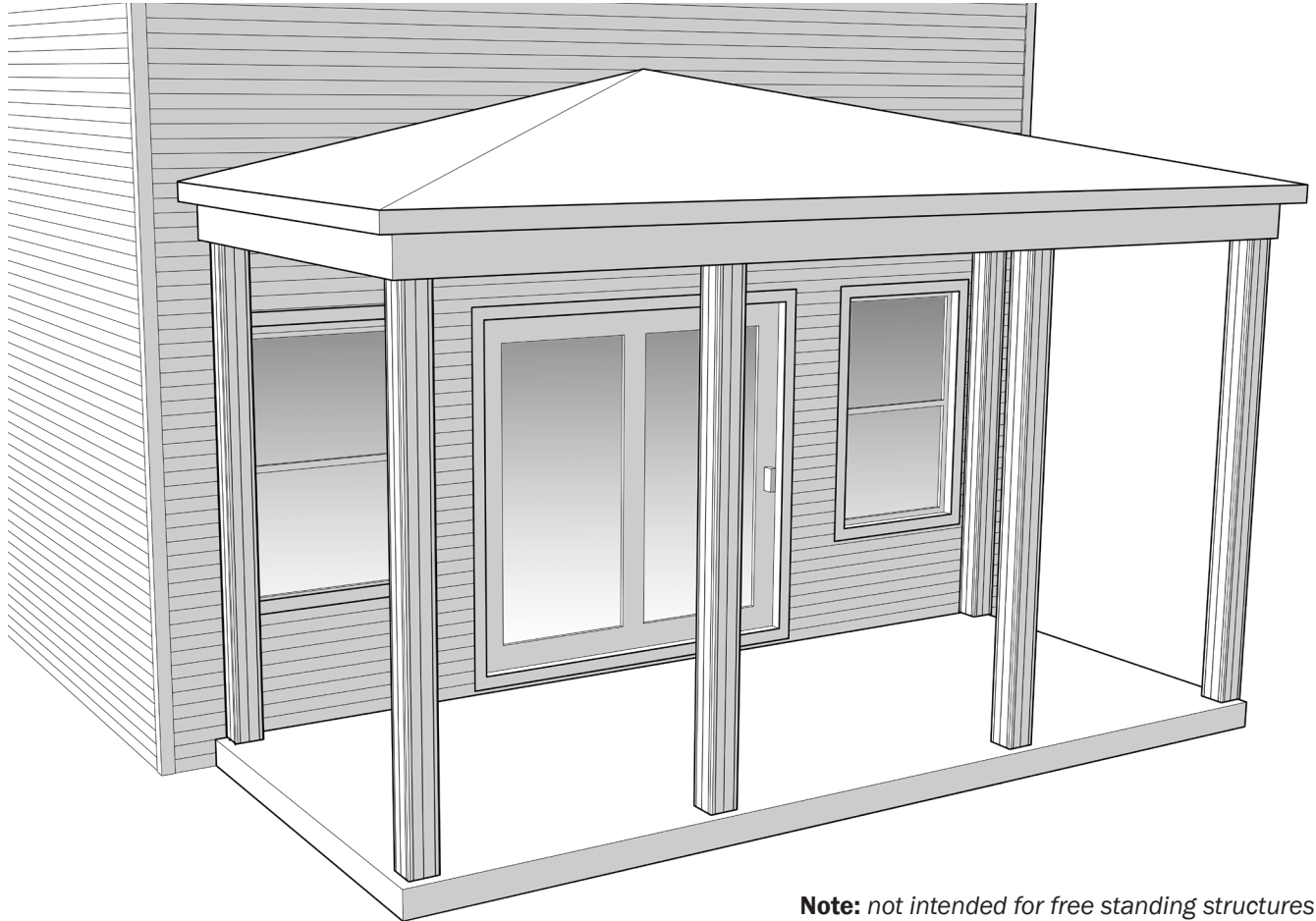

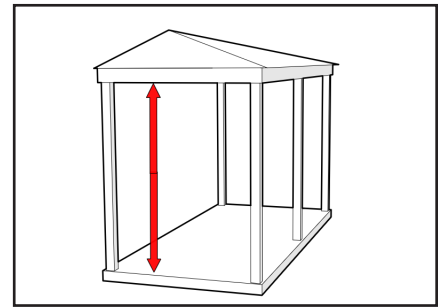
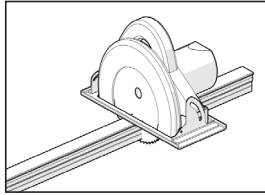

Measure the height of the existing Posts to be covered.

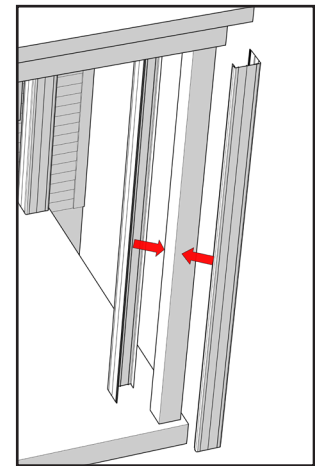
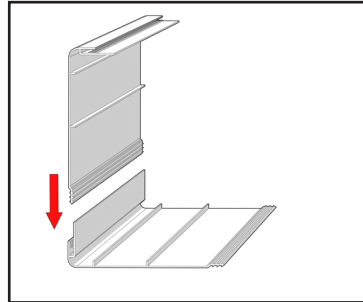
On a Non-Abrasive surface; carefully cut the Wrap Panels to the correct lengths.

! Cutting Tip

Be sure to use a **fine-tooth blade approved for cutting PVC** and rest panels on a piece of **non-abrasive material** to protect from scratches.

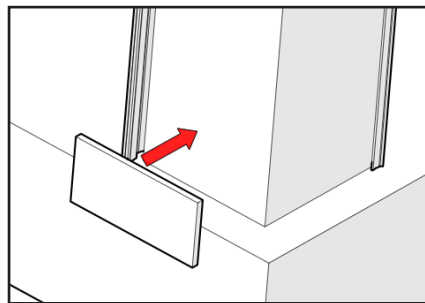


Snap together Panels in pairs then finalize the connection around the post by connecting the pairs.



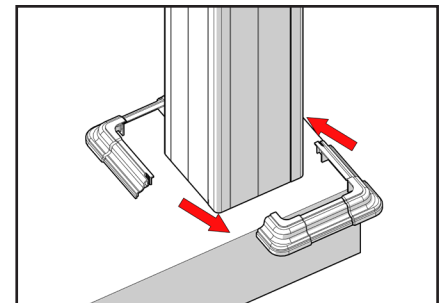
When snapping both pairs around the Post; ensure the Panels are square before finalizing the connection.

If necessary use blocks to expand the sides out to the proper widths at the Top, and Bottom. If you want to prepare for a future railing installation; a 12" block or shim should be placed 32" to 44" from the bottom of the Column; for extra support.



If utilizing Trim; connect the pieces around the Top and Bottom of the Post.

Use four Screws placed on all sides at both top and bottom; just below the edge of the Trim in order to hold them in place.



If Trim is not being used; screws can still be placed at the upper and lower areas of the Wrap Panels to help resist any twisting that might occur with a pressure treated Post.

When using Modular Trim, pieces can be cut down to fit other sizes of Post Wrap.
